Homecare Instructions for Temporary Dentures

- Following your surgery, your temporary dentures will be delivered to you with a soft liner on the inside. For the first few weeks you will not be able to put much chewing force on the dentures, and will be restricted to a soft diet.
- You should keep your temporary dentures in for 24 hours following surgery as they will help stop the bleeding and act as a bandage.
- After 24 hours you may take out the dentures and follow hygiene instructions for the surgical site. Gently brush the inside AND outside of your denture with a tooth brush or denture brush.
- After every meal, you must take out the temporary denture and clean both your surgical site and the denture.
- <u>DO NOT</u> ever immerse your temporary dentures in any liquid, including water, denture cleaners, etc. If after the first 24 hours you wish to keep the dentures out, wrap them in a moist paper towel to prevent them from drying out.
- You will have sutures in for the first 10 days after surgery, therefore the
 use of denture adhesive is not recommended, especially on the lower. If you
 MUST use adhesive on the upper, you may place a dime-sized amount in the
 middle of the palate be sure to keep the adhesive from getting into the
 sutures.
- Once the swelling has subsided, you will notice the temporary dentures are very loose. A new soft liner can be added by the dentist at anytime to improve the fit and comfort of the dentures.
- The dentures can sometimes loosen the healing caps. If this occurs, come into the office to have them tightened/replaced.
